DELOITTE IMPACT DAY TO FOCUS ON HELPING LOCAL NONPROFITS

More than 1,000 DFW Volunteers Will Participate in National Day of Community Service

WHAT: Deloitte IMPACT Day

The Volunteer Center of North Texas is managing 19 different projects for Deloitte's volunteers, including 14 at Dallas nonprofits.

IMPACT Day is Deloitte's annual celebration of its year-round commitment to community involvement. Nationwide, 40,000 Deloitte employees will set aside work for one day to contribute their time and skills to nonprofits. Local projects will benefit groups that serve children, the elderly, the homeless, persons with developmental disabilities, and more.
